# **Biographical Map Library of European Authors**

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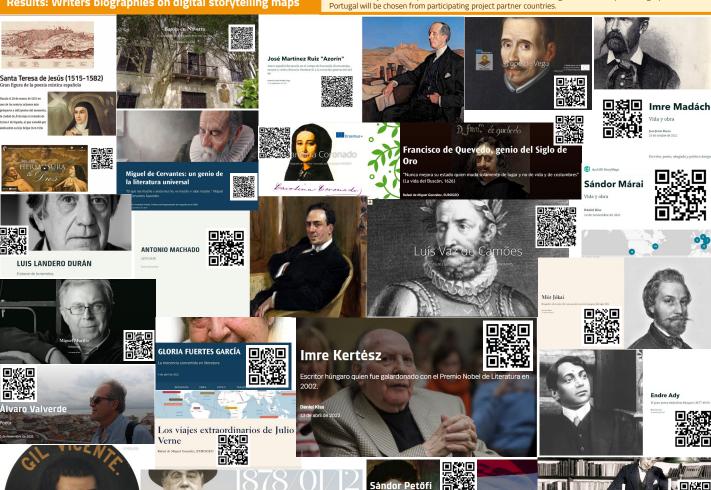
- The aim of the project is to enhance digital storytelling mapping (DSM) for learning literature and raise awareness about social values as part of European cultural heritage
- DSM make it possible to visualize places and journeys that have shaped the life and literary work of famous authors
- · Routes via land and real itineraries with secondary school students, following the curriculum, will contribute to experiential learning.
- Demonstrate that heritage is a source of wealth and can be a generator of economic

## Methodology

- A report will be written on opportunities in the secondary school curriculum to use geographic information systems in the cloud (Web GIS) through the use of literary itineraries (Digital Storytelling Mapping using ArcGIS Online StoryMaps).
- A biography of selected authors will be made using StoryMaps.
- · Literary routes will be created for secondary schools in each of the participating countries (Spain, Hungary and Portugal), within the framework of a short-term stay.
- · Participant and direct observation will be undertaken on students involved in the project, mainly by secondary school teachers and university teachers.

- The story map of the writers can be downloaded and printed to study as textbook content.
- A digital story map is a way of sharing the final results of a particular piece of research.
- Story maps are innovative and attractive tools that are easy to manage and an inspiring way to value literary heritage

- Secondary school students collaborating in the project are already developing linguistic communication skills in Spanish, as a main or a secondary language.
